The competition is for teachers to create an innovative way in which to use a class visit to Brooklands as an inspiration for work at school.

This could be a design and technology project, a science investigation, a maths or literacy activity or artwork, in fact anything inspired by the history and technological achievements of Brooklands in the last 100 years, from early flying and motor racing to Concorde.

The winners will hold the **Ray Gifford Trophy** for a year and receive **free entry to the Museum for up to 30 children on a school visit**. There will also be two runners up prizes of vouchers of £45 to spend either on Museum entry or in the Museum Shop.

A panel chosen by the Museum will judge entries on :

- educational value and skill development
- creativity, originality and presentation of the work delivered
