**SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS**  
**Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> June 2022**

1. Farnborough District Motor Club will organise a Clubmans permit Production Car Autotest at Brooklands Museum, Brooklands Road, Weybridge, Surrey, KT13 0QN on Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> June 2022. The event will be promoted by the Club and Brooklands Museum.
2. The meeting will be governed by the General Regulations of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions the organising Club may issue for the event.
3. Motorsport UK Permit number TBA has been issued for the event.
4. The event is open to all fully elected members of the organising Club, along with members of Basingstoke MC, Bognor Regis MC, Boundless by CSMA, Cranleigh MC, Maidstone & Mid Kent MC, Isle of Wight CC, Sevenoaks & District MC, Southern Car Club, Southsea MC, Vintage Sports Car Club. The event is prescribed as NCAFP by the FIA and Motorsport UK.
5. All drivers and passengers must be in possession of a valid Club membership card and Competition Licence (M10.)
6. All passengers in a Touring Car, or a sports car with the hood erected, or a hard top fitted must be aged 12 years or over, and be at least 135cm tall. Any passenger in a cabriolet/sports car without the hood erected or a hard top fitted, must be aged 16 years or over and be at least 135cm in height.
7. The outline of the event will be as follows, with confirmation of the exact timetable to be issued in the event Final Instructions.

- 9 The competition will consist of a maximum of 6 Driving Tests, attempted twice, with the fastest times on each test counting towards the awards. Test diagrams for the event will be issued at event signing-on. The event will also count towards the overall Double Twelve Competition.
- 10 All cars must carry a passenger when attempting the tests, who must be seated alongside the driver. They must wear a properly fastened seat belt (where required as part of the MOT Test) at all times during the

tests. Passengers must sign on at the same time as their driver.

- 11 Timing will be by hand-held stopwatch, to an accuracy of 10<sup>th</sup> second. Any penalties will be issued as per Table M.7. Competitors will start in their own time, with timing starting as the front axle crosses the start line.
- 12 The event will consist of 8 classes:

Class 1	Pre-war Sports Cars
Class 2	Pre-war Touring Cars
Class 3	Post-war Sports Cars of under 7'0" Wheelbase
Class 4	Post-war Saloon Cars of under 7'6" Wheelbase
Class 5	Post-war Sports Cars of 7'0" to 8'6" Wheelbase
Class 6	Post-war Saloon Cars of 7'6" to 8'6" Wheelbase
Class 7	Post-war Sports Cars of over 8'6" Wheelbase
Class 8	Post-war Saloon Cars of over 8'6" Wheelbase.
- 13 Awards will be presented as follows: Fastest Time of Day – To the competitor with the best performance.  
Class Awards – to 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> competitors in class (2<sup>nd</sup> class award subject to 4 starters, & 3<sup>rd</sup> class award subject to 6 starters in class.)
- 14 Entries open on publication of these regulations and closes on Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> June. All entries must be made via the official on-line entry form. Entries will not be complete until both the completed entry form and entry fee are received. The entry fee is £45.00. In the event of over subscription, competitors who have entered one of the other Double Twelve competitions will be given preference. Entries will be acknowledged electronically.
- 15 The maximum number of entries for the event is 60, and the minimum is 30. The minimum number of starters per class is 4, and the organisers reserve the right to cancel the meeting or amalgamate classes as necessary.
- 16 Provisional results will be published as soon as possible after the event, in accordance with D26.1.2.
- 17 Competitors will be identified by numbers, which will be provided by the organiser, and will need to be affixed to the car where they can easily be seen by the marshals.
- 18 Motorsport UK Regulations are modified as follows:  
M6.6 Some of the markers used in the test may be less than 1M high.  
M8 Marshals in charge of tests are appointed Judges of Fact with regard to false starts, crossing/failing to cross marker lines, touching markers and not following the correct route. All will be listed on the Official Noticeboard.  
M11.3 A car may be entered twice, but for different drivers, each of whom must submit a separate entry.
- 19 All competitors are reminded that they are also able to enter both the Double Twelve Speed Trials and/or the Double Twelve "Pride of Ownership" competitions, which will enable you to compete for the overall Double Twelve trophies, which will be awarded at the end of the event.
