**Event / activity information:** Schools visit Brooklands Museum as part of their educational enrichment. Schools are informed that they must keep full supervision of their students at all time and are provided with a timetable. Brooklands Museum operates a strict safeguarding procedure and policy in place to protect those who are vulnerable and most at risk. Students are permitted to wear their own clothes suitable for the museum, i.e. jeans, trousers, t-shirt, sweatshirt with no offensive, insulting or derogatory phrases. Suitable footwear for site must also be worn.
